# **Engineering a chatbot**

- Research part of the project : University of Paris 8
- Al Deep Learning for chatbot, by Anna Pappa
  - Creating a 17th century theatrical corpus ~100k lines
  - Training the bot with Seq2Seq model
  - Articulating two models:
    - Free conversation using AI model
    - Scripting a guided conversation with the visitor
  - Corpus enrichment through additional visitors/bot interactions

## **Challenges**

- Speaking 17th century French and understanding today's French
- Building up a new database from a corpus of 17th century French theatre
- Processing feeling and emotion (AI impersonating a seductive Don Juan)
- Make a non-closed expert system
- Create a reproducible model for other literary works
